# LOOKING TO THE HORIZON

Dear People of God,

"Yet I will rejoice in the Lord. I will be joyful in God my Savior." The words of the prophet Habakkuk call us to life in this season of Epiphany. Epiphany offers us the opportunity to live in the tension of remembering our celebration of Christmas and already looking to the horizon of Lent. We have only just gathered at the manger with the magi and already we are anticipating the shadows of Good Friday. We live in a season of "give and take" during Epiphany—the same is true of the life the congregation of Ascension Lutheran Church is living these days.

You and I are called to live in relationship with God in Jesus Christ. We are called to share the joy of that relationship with each and every person we meet throughout our day. We often shy away from sharing the joy of who we are as God's children. Habakkuk offers a proclamation of faith for God's people. It is a word of hope and joy that the whole people of God need to hear time and time again. And it should be our prayer that this word of hope and joy is found in and through each of us.

This month we welcome our new Director of Youth Ministries, Tony Acompanado. He will be a wonderful gift to the youth ministries and to our whole community. He brings a passion for Jesus Christ, incredible energy, and a depth of faith that will continue to serve the kingdom of God in this time and place. Please give thanks for his presence among us and for his entire family – Tony's wife, Lori; Savannah (16); Zachary (10); and Isabella (7). What a wonderful gift of God to Ascension in this season of Epiphany. Please hold Tony and his family in your prayers as they transition churches and join us in ministry.

# **BREAD OF LIFE, BODY OF CHRIST**

Each week that I am with you, I am blessed and honored to stand at the front of the sanctuary and serve communion to God's gathered people. Since I arrived in October, we have begun using "real" bread at communion, rather than communion wafers. (Just for the record, wafers are "real" bread too, just in a different form). And each week, as I stand there and speak the words, "The body of Christ, given for you," I am struck by the rich symbolism of the loaf I hold in my hands, in contrast to the wafers that we sometimes use for communion.

Churches have used wafers for centuries, and there are some things to recommend them. They are neat, by which I mean they don't crumble when you place them in someone's hands. They don't break off crumbs into the wine if you are using them for intinction (dipping the bread into the cup). They don't go stale (though some folks might argue that they kind of seem stale to begin with!). They are uniform in size and shape – everyone gets the same thing, every time. There is usually an ample supply tucked away in the sacristy (the room where we keep the worship supplies and worship leaders put on their robes) so the chances of running out at a given service or morning are slim. They're just generally convenient.

Compare that to the loaves of bread we've begun to use here at Ascension. We cannot buy several months' worth at once and store them away. They're too big to hold many in the freezer, and they would go bad pretty quickly otherwise. Bread is messy; as we break off pieces for each person who comes forward with open hands to receive this gift, crumbs fall into the napkin (and hopefully not onto the floor). Each piece that is broken from the loaf is a unique size and shape, and sometimes it ends up being too big to chew and swallow easily before we make it to the wine that is waiting. (I always say that the body of Christ is something worth chewing on for a while, both literally and metaphorically, but I promise that I try to make them manageable bite-sized pieces). Though we never have, it is more conceivable that we could run out of bread at a given worship service or have someone forget to bring it to church when they are supposed to.

Using bread loaves has its potential drawbacks, but I love the symbolism beneath it, because as we receive the body of Christ, we become, together, the body of Christ. And we are a messy lot. Broken. Crumbling around the edges at times. Taking on different sizes and shapes. We worry at times that what we have to offer may not be enough, and we can find each other a bit more than we care to take sometimes. Yet it is beautiful, this messy, crumbly body of Christ. In this bread of life and in each other, we see glimpses of the great feast that is to come, and we are nourished for the journey ahead. What a blessing to share this meal together!

Feasting with you.

# YOUR COUNCIL AT WORK

At January's council meeting, our first agenda item was an update from the Call Team. The discussion centered on the title of the pastor we are planning to call. After some thought and discussion, we approved the title of "Pastor." Current philosophy indicates that congregations are moving away from using "associate pastor" or "assistant pastor."

We reviewed the questions that have been addressed to us regarding the 2014 budget. These included, questions asked at the Budget Forum on Sunday, January 19; questions asked at the Welcome Center; and questions sent via email. We appreciated these inquiries as they gave us new views to consider.

Mary Ellen Comp, co-chair of the Mutual Ministries Team, gave us an update of the process for conducting staff reviews. Reviews are conducted annually by the Mutual Ministries Team members.

Ascension will be 65 years-old on September 14, 2014. Set aside the date to praise God for the many blessings bestowed on us these last 65 years. At this time, we only have the date and planning will begin shortly.

We made two appointments: Shirley Wehmeier as Mission Outreach Wing Leader; and Matt Johnson as Financial Development Team Leader.

We thank Riley Cooper, who led the Mission Outreach Wing and resigned due to a move to Virginia. We also thank Kerry Friedrichshon, who thoughtfully led the Financial Development Team.

With regrets, we accepted the resignation of Erica Probst as Council Member at Large. Marcy Schaefer was approved to complete Erica's term.

Over the past month the Call Team, which is charged with the task of recommending to the congregation another pastor to be added to our ministry team, has met several times. One of these meetings included a representative from the Greater Milwaukee Synod, Pastor Paula Canby, who reviewed the call process with us.

We are now preparing the form, called the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), which will be submitted to council for approval and then sent to the synod to be matched with candidates who are available for Call. The MSP describes our congregation and identifies what we see as our pastoral needs. On the last page of the newsletter is a survey to find out what you think those needs are and to reflect those thoughts in the final document. Please fill it out by Feb. 16 and return it to the church office or drop them in the offering plate on Sunday. You can also fill it out on-line at <a href="https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/JXPZC6Q">https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/JXPZC6Q</a>. After the MSP is sent to the synod it will take about four weeks for them to send us information on three potential candidates for interview.

At the end of 2013, the Vision Ascension campaign to reduce Ascension's Goliath debt has been under way for 32 months. Significant progress has been made toward reducing Ascension's debt.



• The original amount pledged: \$1,140,508

• The amount received through 12/31/13: \$ 940,184

• 297 people have contributed through 12/31/13.

• 196 of those who gave made a pledge.

Half of those who pledged have fulfilled their pledge.

 Half of those who pledged still have an opportunity to fulfill their pledge.

• 101 of those who have given did not make a pledge.

• The impact has been significant.

The amount of debt paid down: \$888,000
The amount of interest saved: \$57,600

• What happens in 2014?

• The Vision Ascension campaign officially ends April 30, 2014.

• Anticipated additional contributions of: \$ 35,000 - \$ 40,000

• Estimated total receipts of: \$975,000 - \$980,000

• Estimated remaining debt: \$1,160,000

• A new campaign, "Ascension Arise," will begin in an effort to attack the remaining debt.

Our mission partnerships are ministries with which Ascension has a deeper, ongoing relationship and/or have been designated as partnerships or Companion Synod relationships by the Greater Milwaukee Synod. These partnerships are relationship based and follow the accompaniment model of walking together with people who may be of a different culture, race, or language yet together we are part of the body of Christ. We are brothers and sisters who share our faith and join our hearts and hands in mutual Christian love, prayer, learning, and gestures of help and care.

Shirley Wehmeier, Mission Outreach Wing Leader Currently, Ascension has three active partnerships: Cross Lutheran Church in Milwaukee, the Lutheran Church of El Salvador, and the Meru Diocese, Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania. During 2014, the Mission Outreach Committee has committed to developing a deeper relationship with each of our partners and to helping the congregation explore new ways to be connected with each of the partners. While traveling to Tanzania or El Salvador may not be an option for many people, there are other ways we can connect with our brothers and sisters in Christ. #### **SOPHIA**

Once upon a time there was a town that was built just beyond the bend of a large river. One day some of the children from the town were playing beside the river when they noticed three bodies floating in the water. They ran for help and the townsfolk quickly pulled the bodies out of the river.

One body was dead so they buried it. One was alive but quite ill, so they put that person into the hospital. The third turned out to be a healthy child, who they then placed with a family who cared for it and who took it to school.

From that day on, every day a number of hodies came floating down the river and, every day, the good people of the town would pull them out and tend to them — taking the sick to hospitals, placing the children with families, and burying those who were dead.

This went on for years; each day brought its quota of bodies, and the townsfolk not only came to expect a number of bodies each day but also worked at developing more elaborate systems for picking them out of the river and tending to them. Some of the townsfolk became quite generous in tending to these bodies and a few extraordinary ones even gave up their jobs so that they could tend to this concern full-time. And the town itself felt a certain healthy pride in its generosity.

However, during all these years and despite all that generosity and effort, nobody thought to go up the river, beyond the bend that hid from their sight what was above them, and find out why, daily, those bodies came floating down the river.
