Where is God working in your life these days? Pastors and people alike should always be prepared and ready to answer such a question. If we are not able to point to the places where God is at work in our lives, our church, and our world – how will God's presence be made known?

As God's people, we have a responsibility to share the stories of God's love and God's presence in the world. We are called to announce such moments and we are invited to reflect those moments into the darkness of this world.


In our world, I am grateful to God for the agreed upon extended cease-fire between Israel and Hamas. I believe God is indeed present in the refugee camps dotted throughout Africa and Asia. I pray daily for the presence of God to be made known in the sufferings of the people of Syria and the dwindling populations of Christians in Iraq and throughout the Middle East.

In my life, God is at work in tending to the little things. I so often take for granted God's work in my life. In the temptations toward self-defeating thoughts; in the words of hope I share but sometimes struggle to believe; in the moments of walking with friends who are in the midst of deep pain for their children, their marriages, their health – God is at work! I believe that God is at work. I believe that part of this journey of faith we walk is to be reminded or remind ourselves that we are, each and every one of us, dependent on God. I need God's love I need God's forgiveness. I need God's grace. I need God to remind me that in the midst of the daily, little deaths we experience that God is present, bringing about little resurrections that point us to the great resurrection of the one who has died for all of us. God is at work.

In our church, I see God at work. In every corner of our community God is doing a new thing. Do you see it? I do. How exciting to welcome a new pastor into our midst! Although, we are waiting on acceptance of the call by Pastor Angela at the writing of this letter – I believe God is at work inside Pastor Angela's heart to move her to acceptance. I see God at work in the painters who are renewing our sanctuary space. I see God at work in the deep and sometimes difficult work of our church council, mutual ministry team, and

ministry leaders. I see God at work in the continued blessing of generous hearts that support the ministry of this congregation, while at the same time continuing to pay down the mortgage. I see God at work in the fall programming that is preparing to take shape for every child of God of every age at Ascension. I see God at work in the small group leadership team preparing to launch *The Power of a Whisper*. Have you heard God's whisper? Are you listening for what God might be speaking to you? Where is God working in your life this day? Maybe God is more present than you know.



This past Monday, I went to visit a family who was anticipating the gift and miracle of new life in their midst with the birth of their third child. I was called to the hospital because an emergency c-section had taken place and the baby – a beautiful baby boy – did not survive. I always approach such moments with a sacred reverence. It is a privilege to be invited into such moments. The difficulty, for me, is in finding anything helpful or hopeful to say in such moments. It so happened that I met the dad and the two older brothers at the door to their mom's room. We talked and entered the holy space of a hospital room where a mixture of shock and grief had replaced the anticipation of a new life into the world.

The mom asked the nurse to bring the baby down and I was honored to sit and hold this baby. All I wanted to do in that moment was weep for this life lost far too soon – truly before his journey had even begun in this world. And as I felt my eyes well up with tears – as I rocked

him – I began to answer the questions of his three-year-old brother. Questions were all over the place and I decided to be direct in my answers. Sometimes, we do not get to take our baby brother or baby sister home with us. Sometimes they go straight to God's arms in heaven. Where is God at work in your life these days? For me, on Monday, God was at work in my mouth and in my heart. I wanted to be strong for two parents who were being strong for their boys - and yet, it took every ounce of strength in my own soul to not shed my own tears over this baby boy and the perfection of his presence in my life even in his stillness. Even as my heart was breaking for this family, God was at work tending to them in ways I could not. There will be always be questions of "why." I have a long list for God including all the "whys" God allows in this world and yet there was a strength of love showing through these two parents that reminded me that God had long been present in their lives and in that hospital room and would continue to carry them into the days ahead.

Where is God at work in your life these days? Everywhere dear friends, everywhere! We only need look for the moments of light in our darkness to see where God has touched us.

I am excited to look for God in my life, our church, and our world in the days ahead. Will you join me in the search? Where, in the midst of death, do you see life returning? "May you see resurrection ever about you," reads the blessing in worship some Sundays. We could just as easily change the word "resurrection" to the word "life" and hear the same blessing of God.

Come, join us in worship, and see where God is at work. Come and celebrate life!


Welcome back!

GRIEF SHARE

The Grief Share Program is a DVD-based Christian program that has 13 weeks of programming addressing different topics of grief. It encompasses a support group of people that are dealing with or have suffered loss. The death of a spouse, child, parent, family member, or friend is devastating. Christians are able to claim an eternal perspective and can rejoice that the person they lost is now in the presence of his or her Creator, but as humans, we must grieve a loss so deep and significant. Even Christians with a solid faith need ongoing comfort and encouragement during the grieving period.

Care Ministries will be hosting this program on Tuesdays, Sept. 9-Dec. 2, for 13 consecutive weeks, 6-8 p.m., in the Youth Room. The

cost is \$15/person for 13 weeks (includes materials for course). If this cost is challenging, please contact me, because we will make exceptions.

Our facilitator is Kathy Kuhn. She is an expert in the area of grief. She was the program director of Healing Hearts for several years and set up their program. She also has worked with the Grief Share program in other churches in our area and is familiar with it. We will provide workbooks, Bibles, and refreshments for the group.

Yes, I hear it. But it is just a whisper. God, that is you speaking to me, right? I'm listening. I want to do whatever you say. Help me. I cannot do it alone. Please. Whisper it to me again.

THE MILITARY FAMILY MINISTRY-ONE YEAR LATER


The Military Family Ministry will be celebrating its one year anniversary next month. We thought this would be a good time to highlight some of the works of this ministry. Over the past year we:
