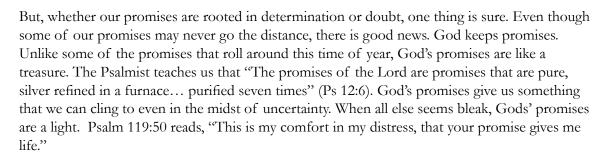

A PRICELESS PROMISE

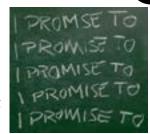

Happy New Year! Can you believe it is 2015? The hustle and bustle of the Christmas season is fading away. The warmth of a merry Christmas is slowly being replaced - here we are welcoming another new year. So you know what that means? That means that people are making promises - the ubiquitous New Year's resolutions. Promises, promises, promises. Certainly, there is nothing wrong with making New Year's resolutions. It's just that they tend to quickly evaporate as the calendar turns to February then March, and let's not even talk about April. You know it's funny - many of us make these resolutions with complete sincerity. While others know full well that our promise is really just a dressed up fib - a lie wearing a tuxedo. Believe me. I've made a few of these myself quite aware that my resolve would weaken and I would eventually revert back to my old habits.



So, sisters and brothers, trusting in God's promises, I encourage you to enter 2015 with new resolve. A wise man once said, "Be the change you wish to see in the world." THE LIGHT OF EPIPHANY

Dear People of God,

I am borrowing the words of one of my favorite poets, Ann Weems, to share with you the hope of this new year. She has an incredible gift to describe with such clarity my feelings of these days after Christmas. She writes:

I must admit to a certain guilt about stuffing the Holy Family into a box in the aftermath of Christmas. It's frankly a time of personal triumph when, each Advent's eve, I free them (and the others) from a year's imprisonment boxed in the dark of our basement. Out they come, one by one, struggling through the straw, last year's tinsel still clinging to their robes. Nevertheless, they appear, ready to take their place again in the light of another Christmas. The Child is first because he's the one I'm most reluctant to box. Attached forever to his cradle, he emerges, apparently unscathed from the time spent upside down to avoid the crush of the lid. His mother, dressed eternally in blue, still gazes adoringly, in spite of the fact that her features are somewhat smudged. Joseph has stood for eleven months, holding valiantly what's left of his staff, broken twenty Christmases ago by a child who hugged a little too tightly. The Wise Ones still travel, though not quite so elegantly, the standing camel having lost its back leg and the sitting camel having lost one ear. However, gifts intact, they are ready to move. The Shepherds, walking or kneeling, sometimes confused with Joseph (who wears the same dull brown), tumble forth, followed by three sheep in very bad repair. There they are again, not a grand set surely, but one children (and now the grandchildren) can touch and move about to reenact the silent night. When the others return, we will wind the music box on the back of the stable and light the Advent candles and go one more time to Bethlehem. And this year, when it's time to pack the figures away, we'll be more careful that the Peace and Goodwill are not also boxed for another year!

The days of Epiphany call us to bask in the light of Christmas. Not the light of a star, but the light of a Savior. Here, the darkness is chased away by the promise of new life. The long nights of winter are beginning to give way to days filled with increasing moments of light. For many of us, the darkness seems to overwhelm us. It is only when we remove our hands covering our eyes and lift up our heads that we are able to see the light of Christ that surrounds us. May you be blessed by the hope that God has already placed within you in these days of Epiphany – these days of light.

FACILITIES UPDATE

2015 brings a few facilities changes at Ascension. Custodian Don Malchow, who had delayed his retirement this summer to get us through a busy fall and Christmas season, has retired.

We are grateful for Don's work here over the past seven years and thank Don for his stewardship of our church.

The good news is that Don will continue to be a member, although we'll probably see less of him here, especially over the summer and hunting seasons as he enjoys his well-earned second retirement.

This fall, with Don's retirement pending, we reviewed options for maintenance and custodial work. Consequently, we contracted with a janitorial company for cleaning duties and eliminated the assistant custodial position for 2015. In the first quarter of 2015, we will be reviewing the remaining custodial position and options for ensuring the upkeep of the building.

During this time of transition and possibly into the future, with no custodian on staff, groups meeting at Ascension will once again be responsible for their own room set-up and clean-up. Both East and West Halls will be set with tables and chairs for use and groups can rearrange them as necessary, making sure to put them back the way they were found for the next people. Groups are also asked to take garbage to the dumpster after their events. This is especially important with food garbage. To summarize: when you're done with your meeting, leave the room like you found it, or even a little better.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation in maintaining our building and being good stewards of what the Lord has given us.

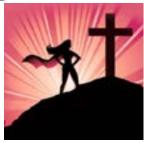

We have been gratified to be approached by a number of Ascension members commenting on how they enjoyed reading about The Daniel Plan in past newsletters. Unfortunately, some people still mistakenly refer to The Daniel Plan as a "diet." It is so much more and that is what makes it so great.

The Daniel Plan is different because it is founded on faith and God is the source of all inspiration and power. The program incorporates guidance in every life area, so you not only get healthy physically, but spiritually, emotionally, and relationally as well. Beyond access to practical food and fitness tips and resources, you will learn how to focus your mind on those things that will encourage healthy choices. This is an ancient biblical principle taught by Paul in Philippians: Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable - if anything is excellent or praiseworthy - think about such things. - Philippians 4:8 (NIV)

Throughout your journey, you are surrounded by friends who offer continual support and encouragement. Even when you experience a setback, you simply make a U-turn and get back on track. While living The Daniel Plan lifestyle, your focus is on progress, never perfection.

Many diets and fitness plans use guilt as a motivation, but that never works in the long run. You can guilt yourself into doing anything short-term, but the change will last only as long as the guilt (or fear) does. In contrast, The Daniel Plan is built with love as the motivation: experiencing
