

THE HOVERING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

How does one begin to say goodbye? Just a few weeks after Easter and already we are prepare to say goodbye to our Savior as Jesus ascends into Heaven to sit at the right hand of God the Father. We feel like we hardly have enough time with Jesus. Even though we have the Word to keep us in tune with the teachings of Jesus and the will of God, it never seems fair at the end of the day that God did not allow for a little more time with God's people while residing in human flesh. The day of Ascension flies by on May 14 this year. We lose Jesus on the cross after some major ministry and teaching, only to be reunited with him at the empty tomb. And in our great joy, realizing that our Savior has now risen from the dead, we get 50 more days of appearances before he ascends into his Father's heavenly kingdom.

It just doesn't seem like enough. I want so much more. I want the time to spend talking with Jesus after he has been to the other side. What is death like? How did it feel to push aside the stone? What was it like to laugh in the face of death as you pulled the grave clothes from your restored body? So many questions we never get to ask. And then, before we know it, the day of Ascension is here and our Savior ascends into heaven and we are left with...what? Is there anything better than Jesus? Why not stay on earth and coordinate a new way of life - a little beginner's course on living a new life in the afterglow of the resurrection?

However, Jesus clearly tells us that after he ascends into heaven, we will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit:

I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. ~ John 14:16-17

What great promise can be heard in those words? It is as if Jesus says, "Not only have I died on the cross for your sins, but in case that wasn't enough to convince you, I will be sending someone to make the whole idea of salvation and the free gift of God's love and grace more understandable." The Holy Spirit is the person who moves in and among us, preparing us for God's will and to hear God's voice and pushing us in directions we sometimes would rather not go. This is the person that now stands as witness to God's great glory and who helps to change our minds, warm our hearts, surprise us, challenge us, and propel us into the work God calls us to do as the people of God.

If we still do not understand what the ascension of Jesus and the gift of the Holy Spirit have in common, Jesus offers these words:

I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. ~ John 14: 25-26

It's as if, in God's great wisdom, the saints are being equipped to do the will and work of God long before we ever heard words like empowerment, equipping, and the priest-hood of all believers. So while there are still millions of *alleluias* to be shouted from rooftops as we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus, the tears of goodbye can be set aside in order to do his work.

We are not passive observers of the ministry of Jesus, his life, death, and resurrection. We are full-fledged priests and participants in the will and the work of the One who is, who was, and who is to come. Come and be party to the great glory of God. Let your hearts fill to overflowing as your joy brings service and your service finds expression. Let that expression be to the glory of God in both the ministry of Ascension, and especially, in the life you lead each day.

With alleluias still ringing.




YOUR COUNCIL AT WORK

What the numbers mean:

- Our general contributions are 8.8% behind plan for 2015, and they are 0.8% behind 2014 actual.
- Our bottom line is \$8,786 behind plan.
- Our general fund balance is currently at a loss.

COLORS OF THE CHURCH

Jesus Christ is central to our worship. Therefore, the items and symbols used throughout our worship space are significant in so far as they point us to the Gospel of the living Christ, our awesome God. With this in mind, let us consider the church year and the liturgical colors.

The Church year begins in late November with the season of Advent and ends the following November with Christ the King Sunday. Broadly speaking, the church year can be classified into six seasons: Advent, Christmas, Time after Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Time after Pentecost.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America provides a system of colors for use by its congregations. They are:

- **BLUE** symbolizes hope. It is the liturgical color for Advent when we celebrate the hope of our coming King.
- GREEN symbolizes growth in faith and growth in Christ. According to ELCA worship
 resources, green can be thought of as a *neutral color* in a sense. Green is used in the church
 year during non-festival seasons, for example Time after Epiphany and Time after Pentecost. These non-festival seasons are also known as Ordinary Time. *Ordinary* in this sense
 means ordinal or numbered.
- **GOLD** is only used for Easter Day. It indicates that this day is the *queen of feasts* the most important festival of the year.
- PURPLE is the primary color for Lent and the alternate color for Advent. Purple has
 two very distinct meanings during each season. During Lent, purple symbolizes penitence,
 repentance, and solemnity. During Advent, purple symbolizes the royalty and majesty of
 the coming King.
- **RED** (should be distinguished from the deeper red of scarlet) symbolizes the fire of the Holy Spirit, as in Acts 2:1-13. Bright red is used for the Day of Pentecost, Reformation Day, martyrs' days, ordinations, and certain church celebrations.
- SCARLET (should be distinguished from bright red) symbolizes the blood of the passion
 of Christ. Scarlet is used from Passion/Palm Sunday through Maundy Thursday of Holy
 Week.
- WHITE symbolizes joy, gladness, and the light of Christ. White is used during the Sundays of Christmas and Easter. It is also used on Holy Trinity and Christ the King Sundays. White is also an alternate color for Easter Day.

Our paraments are more than just church decorations. They carry meaning and inspiration. Let us experience the changes in our worship surroundings with fresh eyes. With our many and varied church traditions, we are afforded a rich tapestry of treasured symbolism that draws us closer to the eternal God revealed to us in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

CARE MINISTRIES

GRIEFSHARE BRINGS HEALING INTO BROKEN LIVES

Ascension does a good job caring for grieving people in our congregation in the immediate days surrounding a death and funeral. Meals are provided, a service is conducted, and cards and bereavement materials are sent. But the griever needs more. A few days after the funeral, most of the people surrounding the griever return to their daily routines not realizing the deep, prolonged impact caused by the death of the spouse, child, family member, or close friend. The griever needs ongoing support and encouragement for months or sometimes years.

Care Ministries recognized this need and implemented programming this past fall and winter called GriefShare, a grief recovery support group. GriefShare is a faith-based DVD series that stresses the importance of a relationship with God as the foundation for healing. The program is 13 weeks and presents materials in a sensitive but clear manner Kathy Kuhn, who has extensive experience working with grief, was hired to run the sessions. The program was promoted through Ascension, area funeral home directors, the GriefShare website, and a campus ministry network at Carroll University. These outlets brought many people from our community to Ascension. We have even had people begin the group at the twelfth week of the program!

Pastor Chris and Pastor Angela have been involved and were able to contribute spiritual comfort. Pastor Angela conducted the *Longest Night* service at Christmastime to assist people suffering with grief during the holiday season.

Our first group, last fall, consisted of 8-10 people from Ascension and our community. Ages ranged from young to old with a large diversity of grief. The group bonded with each other, and we were able to see how people, who in the early weeks of our program were in the deepest depths of grief, were able to heal and want to move forward in their lives. Five of them have become members of Ascension, and some became involved in Ascension activities such as Knitwits, yoga,

CRASH, Mime Ministry, and the El Salvador Mission Trip. God is working with these people and now they are able to rise above their grief and make a difference to others.

In January, we started another GriefShare term. Some people from our first group came back and new people joined. The new group grew to 15 people. The group had heavy matters to unpack and process including: suicide, PTSD, chronic illness, and sudden death. Each of the participants viewed a video series, participated in small group discussions, and used workbooks and Scripture.

I have reached out to other ministries within Care Ministries to connect with this group. Crosses for Christ made each participant a cross keepsake. Living Letters sent each participant a card to let them know that Ascension is praying for and supporting them. Asension's Prayer Shawl Ministry made 15 prayer shawls; each stitched with prayers of comfort and peace. The GriefShare group is immensely grateful for Ascension's outreach.

At the end of the winter GriefShare term, a participant asked for information so that they would be able to facilitate a ministry like this in their home church. Other participants have asked about becoming members of Ascension. Donations have been made to the program, and someone has helped fund an El Salvador Mission Trip delegate. What amazing things our God has done with this group and ministry!

Pastor Angela and I are extending the Ascension GriefShare support group to the last Tuesday of each month beginning on Tuesday, April 28, from 6-7p.m., in Room 106. It will reconnect GriefShare friends and welcome new participants. The group will be called HOPE – Healing Our Pain... Eventually. The group will include a study of the book of Psalms (based on the highs and lows in life), and social activities will also be planned. Please feel welcome to join this group.

A TASTE OF THE DANIEL PLAN

Several years ago, at a health seminar, we learned that research suggests everyone has cancer. Needless to say, we were taken aback. In a recent article by Dr. Michael Williams of Northwestern University Medical School, he states, "At any given time, everyone has up to 10,000 cancer cells in their system. Under normal conditions, when the immune system is strong, these cells are destroyed." When cancer invades someone's system to the point of symptoms and an official diagnosis is given, the patient has most likely experienced an accident, prolonged period of stress, or some other incident that has weakened the immune system.

Many people don't realize the quality of their diet can have a taxing effect on their immune system. When people fill their bodies with processed and sugar laden foods, your immune system attacks the sugar rather than the cancer cells. Sugar is being found to be food for the cancer, aiding its growth. A favorite of our health experts, Dr. Ben Lerner, shared some facts in a recent article about sugar. Many of us have known someone fighting cancer. A normal course of action to determine the cancer's degree is to have a PET scan. Dr. Lerner explains, "Shortly before a PET scan is performed, the patient is injected with sugar containing a radioactive dye. The cancer cells eat the sugar and the dye lights up like a Christmas tree when scanned. That lets the doctors verify whether the cancer has spread. Cancer cells, which grow quickly, are more likely than normal cells to take up larger amounts of the sugar." Dr. Williams concurs by stating, "Thus, it is critical the immune system be maintained in top condition. If the immune system weakens too much, that's when cancer can establish itself."

Would you like to put your cancer cells on a starvation diet? The Daniel Plan is a good start. The Daniel Plan explains how sugar negatively impacts our bodies and then offers some alternatives to keep sweetness in your life.

We purchased a new stand mixer that included a recipe book. As we perused the book, we were reminded how indiscriminately most Americans use sugar. Many recipes called for as much as four cups of sugar! Combine that with all the added sugars in beverages, cereals, snacks, and many processed foods consumed daily and you can just imagine the toll that is having on our bodies! We have not had any traditional sugars in our home for over four years. Life does go on...and you should know, there are always cookies or other sweets for us to enjoy in our freezer...just without the toxic effects of traditional sugar.

This month, we share one of our favorite cookie recipes for you to try and see for yourself. While the recipe calls for coconut sugar, it should not be confused with traditional granulated or brown sugars. Coconut sugar is extracted from coconut palm trees and possesses the desirable properties found in other coconut products and is also low glycemic so it doesn't cause insulin spikes. Coconut sugar can also be substituted at a 1:1 ratio with brown sugar in any of your favorite recipes.

ALMOND SPICE COOKIES

- 1½ c Ground Almonds (or Almond Meal)
- 1/3 c Coconut Sugar
- 1 tsp Pumpkin Pie Spice (or Cinnamon)
- 1 Egg
- Raw Sesame Seeds

In a medium bowl, combine almonds, sugar, and pumpkin pie spice. Add egg and slowly mix until dough forms. Scoop by rounded teaspoons onto parchment lined baking sheet. Press each cookie down using the bottom of a flat glass dipped in raw sesame seeds. (The thinner the cookies are pressed, the crisper they will bake.) Bake at 325 degrees for 20-24 minutes. Makes about 1 ½ dozen cookies.


