

Dear Sisters and Brothers,


Sometimes our world can be a rather depressing place filled with many occasions for despair. When we look around we see broken relationships, job loss, natural disasters, and increased violence. In the face of such dismal realities, words escape me, so I rely on God's sacred word. We trust God's promise that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39) Trusting in God's faithful presence, we have hope. If we look closely, even in our most difficult times, we can see God's hand - the hidden hand of God. If we are intentional, we can learn to recognize God's activity through the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. But it takes practice.

They are responsible for their own level of challenge, and almost all of them will choose to move far beyond their original decision to only go "so high" on the Tower of Terror. I often speak of this life we live as a journey of faith. We are certainly watching that journey unfold for our junior high students during this week of Adventure Camp.

The Angel Gabriel said to Mary: "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy." In this adventure we travel as the people of God at Ascension, God has smiled on us with great blessing in these last weeks of June, and I can share joyful news.

In September and October, we will have the opportunity for the congregation to reflect on and ask questions about the statements and action plans to move us to 2025.

God is offering so much in the midst of these summer months. Please join us in the celebrations of the new design of staff positions and in the continuing visioning for Ascension's future.

On a side note – July 7 is the day Tony and I leave for the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering in Detroit, MI, which begins on July 15. We covet your prayers for the final planning, the 20 participants from our own congregation, and the 30,000 other high school students, adult leaders, bishops, and pastors who will join us on the journey. Peace and joy be yours in these summer days.

It is an exciting time to be on council as our Vision ARISE 2025 evolves, and you will have input in a huge part of the process.

CHURCH DIRECTORY



RED CROSS BABYSITTING CLINICS

Babysitting certification classes will be August 17 and 19 for teens and pre-teens, ages 11 years-old and up. One full-day class is required to become certified. GRIEFSHARE, DIVORCECARE, & DIVORCECARE 4 KIDS

Death and divorce are both times of struggle in personal lives. Christians with a solid faith still need ongoing comfort and encouragement during these difficult periods. Therefore, Care Ministries is planning new programs at Ascension called DivorceCare and DivorceCare 4 Kids. The programs are structured to help families dealing with all aspects of divorce. Care Ministries also plans to offer another GriefShare program for people who are grieving the loss of a loved one.



All these programs utilize facilitators, videos, workbooks, music, crafts, and activities that address grief in a biblical context, along with ongoing support and discussion groups. They are all 12 week programs that will be on Tuesday evenings, beginning September 1, from 6-8 p.m. DivorceCare programs will be held in the Spiritual Growth Wing, and GriefShare will be held in Ascension's Youth Room. MEAL DONATIONS

Imagine a single parent rushing home from work, picking up children from daycare, rushing home to feed them, and trying to get to a meeting by 6 p.m. on Tuesday nights.

Now, imagine the recent loss of a spouse and the newly single adult making a meal for one - night after night - in the midst of grief.

Care Ministries wants to help people in these situations during the Tuesday night programs, GriefShare, Divorce-Care, and DivorceCare 4 Kids. It would be nice for our DivorceCare families to not feel rushed and enjoy a meal when they come to our programs. It would be nice to provide fellowship and companionship to our GriefShare participants.

Therefore, Care Ministries is asking if Ascension small groups would volunteer to provide and serve a meal on a Tuesday evening. The programs are 12 weeks long, and the meals will be in West Hall, at 5:30 p.m. The meals can be as simple as pizza or subs. ADOPT A GRIEVING CHILD

With the new DivorceCare 4 Kids program (DC4K), Care Ministries needs help supporting children struggling with divorce. Waukesha County has the third highest divorce rate in the state. In 2014, the number of divorces in Waukesha County was 1,084 impacting 1,080 children younger than 18. 52 % of all Wisconsin divorces in 2014 involved couples with children, ages 18 and younger. DC4K will help children heal from the hurt caused by the separation or divorce of parents. They will make friends with other kids who understand how they feel and the things they are going through.

We would like to make this program affordable for participants, and we need your help. Please consider *adopting* a grieving child for \$25. Many participating families will have multiple children and so this *adoption* will be necessary for them to afford this program. The money for your *adoption* will provide the following: DC4K workbooks (\$15/each), activity supplies, facilitator or childcare fees, and snacks and drinks. Care Ministries is seeking 100 benefactors willing to help support these children.

A TASTE OF THE DANIEL PLAN

The Daniel Plan refers to it as The White Menace. Wow...sounds foreboding! It is. It is one of the biggest threats to our health. It is a contributor leading to the cause of ALL age-related chronic disease including: heart disease, high blood pressure, stroke, cancer, type 2 diabetes, and dementia. By now, we hope you're begging to find out what we're talking about. Quite simply...it's SUGAR!

Hunter-gatherer populations consumed 22 teaspoons of sugar per year. Now, the average American consumes 22-30 teaspoons of sugar PER DAY! In 1800, the average person the mysteries of sugar and its toxic effects. consumed 5 pounds of sugar per year. Today, In our house, we look at sugar like we look Americans average 152 pounds per year.

You may be thinking, "Wait a minute. That's impossible! I have not purchased 600 pounds of sugar for my family of four this year." Sugar is contained, or may actually be hidden in much of or even most of what we consume. As an example, a 20 ounce soda contains 15 teaspoons of sugar (that's 1/3 cup!) Right up there are many of those favorite Starbuck's coffee drinks as well. Processed foods like many grains, rices, and fruits are just as harmful. (Sugar is sugar)! Sugar is also hidden under many different pseudonyms, which makes it challenging even for someone making the conscious decision to lower or eliminate their amount of sugar intake. Google "different names for sugar." You wil find lists numbering 50-60 different names for sugar.

When sugar enters your body, it triggers a

cascade of changes in your body that makes you sick and fat. Here's what happens: you ingest sugar or refined carbs like white flour or pasta; your blood sugar spikes; your insulin levels spike. Insulin triggers the storage of belly fat and increases your appetite and sugar cravings. The sugar turns on a cholesterol factory in your liver increasing LDL, lowering HDL, and raising triglycerides. This leads to a "fatty liver" now affecting 60–90 million Americans.

The Daniel Plan will help you sort through at the devil. We work diligently to keep it out of our lives. We know what is in everything we buy. As a result, we make most things completely from scratch because there is so little that does not contain one of the 50-60 sugars out there. In fact recently, we were horrified to find that our favorite protein powder that we rely on daily for our protein bars and smoothies now had a new ingredient - Maltodextrin - one of the most common pseudonyms for sugar. There was no change to the label...no "new and improved" stamp on the front, nor any mention of a "new formula." It was listed in the fine print of the ingredients. This has happened before to us with other products. That is why you have to hold a constant vigil just like with the devil.

Our prayer for our church family is good health. We pray that you will hear God's call to start you and your family on the road to health through The Daniel Plan.

SCINTILLATING SORBET

Ingredients

- juice and zest of 1 lemon
- 1/2 cup sliced fresh strawberries
- 1/2 cup fresh raspberries
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- Vanilla Crème Stevia: 5-10 drops to taste*

Preparation:

- 1. Add lemon juice, zest, and fruit to blender. Blend for 30-60 seconds.
- 2. Add stevia a couple drops at a time. Do not over sweeten or it will taste bitter. Blend until smooth.

*Stevia is a natural herb and can be found in the organic baking sections. We recommend Sweetleaf brand which is sold in ear drop style bottles. The contents go a LONG way and can also sweeten coffee or bottled or sparkling water...anything!



ASCENSION SUPPORTS OFH FAMILY BIKE RIDE FOR 8TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR: SEPTEMBER 12, 2015, ST. BRUNO PARISH, DOUSMAN

From a bike ride and picnic for 25 in 2008 at the Lloyd and Jo Buth property in Dousman, seeds were planted for what has become the signature fundraising event for Outreach For Hope, a Ministry of the Greater Milwaukee Synod - ELCA. This year, money raised will help fund programs and ministries that provide opportunities for transformation and hope among 19 congregations in some of the poorest neighborhoods in Milwaukee, Racine, and Kenosha. Ascension members have been leading contributors in ridership, volunteers, and donations since the event began.

2015 GOAL IS \$120,000

Our most ambitious goal yet has been supplemented this year by a special \$50,000 Challenge Grant in memory of Ned Bechthold, who played a pivotal role in the early years of Outreach For Hope. In this 8th year, this event will have generated nearly a half million dollars of support to ministries serving some of the poorest neighborhoods in southeastern Wisconsin.
