SO MUCH TO CELEBRATE! COME AND SEE!

If you have not heard the shouts of joy coming from the rooftop of Ascension, let me share the good news. At the end of July, our mortgage balance finally found life under the \$800,000 mark. In 2011, we began the journey of debt reduction with more than \$2,200,000. It has been a long journey to this moment, but God has been faithful to us! We give thanks and praise to God for the faithful hearts the Holy Spirit continues to shape within each of you to eliminate the power our mortgage debt holds over Ascension.

We are quickly approaching our fall programming. Sept. 6 welcomes a new Sunday morning worship schedule with the movement of our 9 a.m. service to an 8:30 a.m. start time. Our 10:45 a.m. service remains the same. On Sept. 6 at 10:45 a.m., we will worship outside in the Memorial Gardens to celebrate the beauty of God's creation. Please joins us. On Sept. 13, we kick-off our new Children's Ministry programming, which begins at 9:45 a.m. under the ministry umbrella of Tony Acompanado, Director of Faith Formation. We are retiring the legacy of the title Sunday School from our ministry at Ascension and using the title Children's Ministry. We celebrate the strong energy of volunteers who are coordinating, teaching, storytelling, and helping to shape the fall ministry experiences for our children. Where can you serve? Email Tony, Tony@ascensionelca.org, and he can share a number of short-term or one-time opportunities in which you can be involved to share the gifts God has given you.

We are also re-introducing pastor-led Adult Education on Sunday mornings. On Sept. 13, Tony will share the scope of Faith Formation and the new path for Children's Ministry. Beginning on Sept. 20, Pastor Angela kicks off our six-week Small Group Campaign, *Engaging Scripture Through a Lutheran Christian Lens*. I am especially excited to have Ascension offer a pastoral perspective on reading, studying, and interpreting the Bible and then to have small groups dig deeper each week of the campaign. In early November, I will offer three Sundays of education on the book of Luke, which will be our primary preaching text for Dec. 2015–Nov. 2016. There is so much more already being planned and I am excited!

Our Music Ministry is preparing to *make a joyful noise* in new ways this fall. Please consider taking a *leap of faith* by joining the choir or ringing a bell. Do you play an instrument? Then, Vicki Taylor, Director of Music Ministries, would love to talk with you about sharing your gift in worship. We are always happy to add communion assistants, readers, ushers to our ministry volunteer lists and we are happy to train you.

These programs offer support structures for people working through some of the most difficult times in their lives. A new member experience called Starting Point begins Sept. 27. I am excited to get to know those who are considering Ascension for their new spiritual home.

And just when it is time for a deep breath – ARISE 2025 is coming together in great ways. The Church Council and ministry leaders have been working on our 2025 vision since last February. We are very excited to watch God shape the years ahead. The council has done much of the behind-thescenes work and will be ready for the congregation to share in the joy on Sunday, Sept. 27, for a first-round listening/sharing session. The council will revise the visions using comments from the congregation and then be ready to share again at a listening/sharing session on Oct. 25. Finally, with more revision by council, we will hold an unveiling/blessing/acceptance by the congregation at our Annual Meeting on Nov. 8. What a joy to trust in God's guiding hand.

Finally, on Sept. 13 and 20, we invite everyone to wear nametags to help all of us get to know names and faces – reminders are always a good thing! LISTEN, GOD IS CALLING

Recently, someone asked me what the word vocation means. My initial thought is a call from God. God's word is brimming with call stories. For example, God extended the priestly call to Samuel in an audible voice when Samuel was just a little boy (1 Samuel 3). God called Queen Esther to perilous heroism through the urging of Mordecai, her adopted father. She was called to risk her life to save God's people (Esther 4:12-15). In the Gospels, we witness Jesus personally calling his disciples by interrupting their daily routines (Matthew 4:18-22, Luke 5:1-11). God sent the angel, Gabriel, to proclaim to Mary that she would carry the Savior of the world (Luke 1:26-38).

Webster defines vocation as 1 a: a summons or strong inclination to a particular state or course of action; especially: a divine call to the religious life ... 2 a: the work in which a person is employed: OCCUPATION.

Defining vocation is helpful because, in many segments of our North American society, our careers are closely linked with our identities. Often, it is necessary to remind ourselves

that what we do is not the totality of who we are. For instance, my three primary vocations are that of wife, mother, and pastor. Yet, I cannot be fully encapsulated in either one - or all three for that

our joy and our sense of fulfillment, our spiritual senses will sharpen. Then we will be in a better position to hear God's voice.

Hearing God's voice: What we are called to do

The words vocation, avocation, and voice share the same Latin root, vocare, which means to call. Certainly, most of us have not heard the audible voice of God calling to us in the middle of the night. Nor have many of us received a visit from an angel or a personal invitation from Jesus compelling us to immediately leave our occupations. However, even without such supernatural experiences, we are no less called than Mary, Esther, or Paul. Yes, we are called. We are called through our baptism.

Our baptismal call

Through baptism, we become children of God. The language of the baptismal rite is clear, "You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized." At the font, the pastor traced the cross on our foreheads and proclaimed, "You are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever."

> Through baptism, we receive the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit serves to empower us to live into our baptismal call. We are called to trust God, proclaim Christ, care for others, God's creation, and work for justice and peace.

Earning a living: What we are paid to do

and seemingly compete. Let's take a closer look...

Many of us work to earn a living. Our vocation is our job - the way we make ends meet. We go to work day after day, not because we necessarily want to, but because we have to. We are motivated by simple economics or even basic survival. Sadly, even though we benefit monetarily, we may be depleting our joy reserves. What we gain in financial security, we may be sacrificing in personal fulfillment.

Finding fulfillment: What we love to do

Perhaps you have heard some version of the old adage "Do what you love and then find a way to get paid for it." Some of us may have the joy of finding fulfillment through our careers. But for many, this is not the case. Fortunately, in these situations, we can turn to our avocation. According to Webster, avocation is "a subordinate occupation pursued in addition to one's vocation especially for enjoyment: hobby." If you love to garden, get your hands in the earth. If you love to run, lace up your shoes and hit the pavement. If you love to write, open your journal and get busy! As we increase

Wake up! Get up! And SHINE!

Perhaps our most challenging vocation is for us to simply be - ourselves. I'm not merely talking about finding your talent and sharing it with the world. Discovering our gifts and talents is admirable and even vital, but how can we use our gifts to reflect God's glory. Isaiah extends a call to God's people in exile, "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you" (Isaiah 60:1). I am thoroughly convinced that this vocation extends to us as well: Wake up. Get up. And SHINE! This calling connects us to the baptismal waters where we initially received our vocation. Perhaps this is why, after baptism, we are given a candle with these words, "Let your light shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." So, whether we are pastor or parishioner, mother or mogul, single or spouse, wealthy or wanting, God is calling us to a bold vocation: Wake up. Get up. And SHINE!

ENGAGING OUR LUTHERAN LENS: HOW LUTHERANS INTERPRET THE BIBLE

Ascension's 2015 Fall Campaign will focus on engaging scripture through a Lutheran lens. As Lutherans, we have wonderful gifts to offer the body of Christ. We are excited to engage the sacred texts with a prominent Lutheran theologian. Dr. Mark Allan Powell is a Lutheran pastor and Bible professor at Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Columbus, Ohio. In this six-week video series, Powell invites us to explore important questions about Lutherans and the Bible. He does not prescribe the Lutheran way to read the Bible, nor does he dismiss the way you may have come to understand the Bible. Instead, Powell presents a variety of Lutheran perspectives for interpreting the Bible. Through Powell's rich discussions, we will discover answers to questions we have about the Bible.

Our small group kick-off begins the week of Sept. 20. Our Lutheran Lens Bible Study will culminate with a special worship service on Reformation Sunday, Oct. 25.

GRIEFSHARE BEGINS AGAIN ON SEPT. 1

We are providing an adult grief support group at Ascension. A TASTE OF THE DANIEL PLAN

Happy New Year! That may sound like a strange thing to say this time of year, but for us, each September seems like a whole new beginning at Ascension. It's like the feeling we get when we hang up a new calendar in January. As hard as we try, somehow it seems like our focus during the summer months shifts away a little bit from our faith life. As Wisconsinites, we feel compelled to cram as much as possible into those three summer months. When September comes, we pack away our summer toys, and things ramp up at church again. It is a chance to re-focus.

The word *focus*, one of the five essentials taught in The Daniel Plan, makes us think of an anecdote that Rick Warren shared in his video series. He speaks about the care of peach trees paralleling our lives. When peach trees grow, they are filled with an abundance of small peaches that result from all the spring blossoms. In order to end up with a successful peach harvest, growers must prune the majority of the small peaches so the tree has enough energy to mature the remaining peaches.

People's lives today are much like the peach trees early in the growing season. They are weighed down with so much superfluous *stuff* (small peaches) they really don't have the time and energy to accomplish anything well. Rick Warren says, "The secret to an effective life is focus. Don't try to do fifty things you dabble in. Know what's important and do those things." In other words, prune your peach tree and reap a bountiful harvest!

This time of year seems like a good time to encourage you to take stock of what's going on in your life and consider pruning some peaches. We believe the health of your mind, body, and spirit should be your first priority. Good health gives you more energy and a positive attitude to be a better parent, spouse, friend, and servant.

SPICED PECANS

Ingredients:

1/4 c Coconut Sugar 1/2 tsp Cold Water

½ tsp Cinnamon ½ tsp Raw Honey (or Coconut Nectar)

½ tsp Sea Salt ½ lb Raw Pecan Halves

1 Egg White Organic Butter (preferably Kerrygold Butter)

Preparation:

- 1. In a small bowl, mix coconut sugar, cinnamon, and sea salt together and set aside.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk egg white and water until frothy. Add raw honey and mix until combined. Add pecans to egg mixture and toss until thoroughly coated. Pour sugar and spice mixture over coated nut mixture and toss until thoroughly coated.
- 3. Grease cookie sheet liberally with butter. Pour coated nuts onto pan and distribute into a single layer. Bake at 225 degrees for 75 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes. Allow to cool and store in covered container.




EL SALVADOR PARTNERSHIP

TANZANIA WATER PROJECT

Did you know that Ascension, along with other congregations in the Greater Milwaukee Synod, supports the Tanzania Water Project? Like many poor nations around the world, Tanzania suffers from serious issues involving safe water. In a nation where one third of the country is arid to semi-arid, it is very difficult for people to find access to clean, sanitary water if they don't live near one of the three major lakes that border the country. As a result, Tanzania's ground water is the major source of water for the nation's people; however, it's not always clean. Many of these ground water wells are located near or next to toxic drainage systems, which leak into the fresh ground water and contaminate it. Consequently, Tanzanians turn to surface water which contains things like bacteria or human waste; and people have no choice but to drink from, bathe in, or wash their clothes in these areas. According to the Tanzania national website, water-borne illnesses, such as malaria and cholera account for over half of the diseases affecting the population, because people don't have access to sanitary options.

In a household where money is scarce, daughters and mothers have to spend several hours each day walking to get water from pumps and they run the risk of being attacked or raped. Young girls often drop out of school in order to collect the water that is needed for the family. The Water Project works with the Tanzanian people to provide safe and clean water so that the families have this life sustaining resource.
