

A Taste of The Daniel Plan

or many small business owners like us, a major stressor and financial drain is the rising cost of health insurance. A couple of years ago, our accountant told us about an opportunity to help us reduce our health insurance costs which turned out to be a major blessing in our lives. We joined a Christian health sharing organization known as Samaritan Ministries. Each month, rather than sending a premium to some huge insurance conglomerate, we send a check to a fellow Christian with a medical need. It is a tremendous feeling to pray for and help out a specific person with a name and a face rather than contributing to the construction of another skyscraper.

We'd like to share a story with you that illustrates why we dedicate our lives to educating people on living a healthy lifestyle through the Daniel Plan. An incredible thing happened to us last month as we were putting the finishing touches on last month's Daniel Plan article. I (Steve) was reading the final draft of the article to Carol. As I read the final sentence, "Why not make a resolution...no, make a DECISION that this is the year you will start treating your body with the same loving care that Christ shows you?" In a moment of disillusionment, I thought to myself, "Does anybody really read this? Will anybody act on this?" Well, we know people read the article because they tell us they do, but still it made me wonder.

Deflated, I went to get the mail. To my surprise, in our mailbox was an envelope with a return address from a vaguely familiar person that I couldn't quite place. Shortly after I opened the letter and started reading the letter, I was overcome by emotion and had to stop reading for a moment. Turns out, the letter was from one of the Samaritan Ministries recipients to whom we had sent a check several months back to help cover their medical expenses.

I began reading the letter from Chester to Carol. He thanked us for our prayers. He also thanked God for allowing the cancer to take control over his body and for getting his attention in a way he could no longer ignore. He went on, "It has been four months since I had a cancerous tumor removed from my abdominal wall. I chose not to go through radiation or chemotherapy. I chose instead to take the natural route of immunotherapy which included heavy IV infusions of different vitamins and a big change in my diet. This helped build my immune system back up so that it could fight the cancer cells. Now my body seems to be in better health than it has been in years. My quality of life has been drastically improved. The Apostle Paul tells me in 1st and 2nd Corinthians that if the Holy Spirit is in me, then my body is a temple of God. I needed to take better care of the temple and God has shown me the way to do just that."

God answered Chester's prayer and Chester inspired us with a great testimonial to what The Daniel Plan can do for everyone.

Literacy and Refugees

n December, Mission Outreach launched a new ministry to address the barriers for refugees and new immigrants who live in our community. Ascension has long been a welcoming home to refugees from all over the world. Jo Buth continues to work with refugees from Burma and has identified the need to learn English as their greatest barrier to success. When we started to work with The Literacy Council of Greater Waukesha, we anticipated six students might participate. By mid-January, we had 23 students! Each week, we have had one or two new students. We have 21 volunteers. The volunteers work in teams so students become familiar with more than one tutor and to allow for times for tutors to miss a session without interrupting the learning process. Students are grouped by their English ability not by their first language. We are already seeing the benefit of the relationship, not only between student and tutor, but also between the students and between the tutors. One of the tutors emailed me and said, "I can really feel that God is touching my life through this program."

As a goal in Vision 2025 for Mission Outreach, the need was identified to do more "in our own backyard" outreach. This program is a direct response to the community need and fits our vision and goals.

We anticipate that the program will grow, so we continue to welcome more volunteers. In addition to tutoring, we have a need for volunteers in the following areas: babysitting for a small child so mom can attend, assisting with resources, and assisting a tutor with a group. Winter Shelter

The men's overflow shelter at the old Northview School has been welcoming guests since the first of January. The need for supplies will continue through April. Donna Savin is leading a collection for bedding, towels, disposable dishware, non-perishable food items. Financial donations of \$30 can provide shelter for one individual for one night or help provide a motel room for women and children when the current shelters are full.

The shelter offers personal sleeping space; breakfast; bathroom and shower facilities; transportation to and from the location; and an array of support services, such as job and housing searches, mental health services, and alcohol and drug abuse counseling, to assist guests in gaining independence and stability. The shelter is open seven days a week from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Financial Report

December was fantastic! Ascension is a very giving congregation. Contributions for the month were \$80,595 and \$618,857 for the year. Ascension met the mission giving goal. Ascension ended the year with a loss of only \$1,432.00. This is significant as Ascension was facing a YTD loss of about \$26,000 at the end of November. What a month!

Looking to 2017: As a reminder, at the annual meeting, the congregation approved the 2017 budget, which includes total contributions being \$640,875.00. This is \$22,018 more in contributions than where the church ended the 2016 year. If each family gives \$127.00 a month, Ascension will meet the total annual budgeted contributions.

The 2017 budget also assumes there is a tenant residing at 412 Moreland for 5 months and then the home will be sold. As of January 15, 2017, the Moreland home has been vacant since mid-July 2016.

On a personal note: after much prayer, thought, and guidance from family, I have resigned from the Treasurer position effective Jan. 31, 2017. I am very thankful for the council's, the congregation's, and the pastors' support and prayers this past year as I learned the intricacies of the church's finances.
