uly 2017 and the grace of God took Ascension to the mountaintop! What joy it brings to share with you the events of the last month and all that is coming in the days ahead. July gathered our CRASH high school ministry to a first-time "Mission Next Door" event, in which each day, the students and adult leaders gathered for devotions and breakfast and then headed out into the community. Day one took our high school servants to the Memorial Gardens and flower beds all around the church campus. A full day of weeding, tending, and shaping the space all the way to the ash garden. An incredible day! Later in the week, the Waukesha food pantry would get a cleanup inside and a makeover outside complete with mulched flowerbeds. Thursday took the students to one of our member's homes for a healthy weeding of flowerbeds and the tending of a relationship. In the middle of "Mission Next Door," Ascension welcomed the arrival of our brothers and sisters from El Salvador. Bienvenidos!

Thursday was full of feasting and canning and swimming at Ottawa Lake. Friday was busy with tours of partner churches in Milwaukee, community gardens, and captured rainwater projects. But, my favorite part came Friday afternoon when we gathered to bowl at Bayshore, where there are video screens and glowing neon lights. Explaining bowling in Spanish was fun to watch. Explaining in signs and gestures was even better. Watching the smiles unfold when just one pin fell down and the ball stayed out of the gutter. Now that was priceless.

I tell you God is at work! I am grateful to our Mission Outreach Team under the leadership of Wing Leader, Shirley Wehmeier. It is wonderful to watch the church be exactly who the church should be with hospitality overwhelming and joy overflowing. Edwin and Sarah Aparicio have been incredible hosts and representatives of Ascension as they have navigated translation after translation after translation and every blessed detail of the delegation's visit. A moment of great celebration took place on Sunday, July 16 with a gathering at the home of the Wehmeiers for the





delegation, church staff, church council, and partner churches. It was a glorious day. We heard updates on EVERYTHING! But most importantly – we feasted – we played volleyball – we had one-on-one conversations with Pastor Julio about healthcare, challenges of ministry in El Salvador, and especially the deep concern and request for prayer for the children and young adults of El Salvador. Please include them in your prayers – especially for the opportunity to simply and safely grow up. In my sermon from July 16, I spoke of the belief that the visit by the delegation from El Salvador was nothing short of a miracle. It is true - every word. The journey is a gift of God in every single way. Thank you for your hospitality of the delegates through the days of the visit and in worship.

Our very own Pastor Angela stood upon a mountaintop as she preached at the closing worship of the Women's Triennial Gathering in Minneapolis in July. Over 3,000 heard her inspired preaching. As the story goes – from more than one colleague - the place erupted in thunderous applause to the glory of God when Pastor Angela said, "Amen!" What joy to hear of Pastor Angela's sharing of the Good News in such an amazing way!

What can you learn from the stories of these mountaintop moments? So very much! In all these things, we are reminded that God goes before us. We remember that we need to hear the story of God's love as much as we tell the story of God's love. We remember that the great cloud of witnesses that surrounds our worship and our faithfulness to God has grown once again – with the great and faithful servants of CRASH serving our God and God's people; with the visit of the saints of San Jorge and Usulutan; and with the great gift of good news shared by Pastor Angela!



### YOGA Classes Sept. 11-Oct. 30

Yoga will benefit you whether you are young or old, lean or heavily built, rich or poor, from higher or lower middle class, busy, over busy, or retired, or a worker in the factory or in the field. Yoga has something valuable and useful to offer to everyone. It is often described as the best form of health insurance for all from the age of 7 to 77 or more. Two main advantages of yoga are the prevention of disorders and ailments and maintenance of health and fitness in daily life. Other advantages include flexible muscles; supple joints; a relaxed and tension—free mind; efficiently working vital organs such as the heart, lungs, endocrine glands, liver, pancreas; and a good balance between various functions, such as neuromuscular coordination, etc.

This fall, Care Ministries is offering an eight-week Yoga session on Monday nights, Sept. 11–Oct. 30, from 6-7 p.m., in East Hall. Our excellent Yoga instructor, Jessica Popp will be teaching the class. The cost is \$20 (only \$2.50/class). Sign up on the Care Ministries bulletin board. Bring your water bottle and mat. ### Care Ministries: Extreme Weather Preparedness

hope each of you have been able to get out and enjoy our summer months. This June turned out to be the fourth-hottest month ever recorded - globally - scientists are reporting. With more heat waves on the horizon, and a big one currently sweeping much of the U.S., the risk of heat-related health problems has also been on the rise. August can be a month of extreme heat here in Wisconsin. Some of these weather systems may also create stormy weather. It is important to take precautions and plan for any heat or storm related situations. The following steps will prepare you to handle the associated risks:

- 1. Plan to be temporarily self-sufficient if the electricity goes out. How can potential power outages during extreme heat affect you? Make provisions for medications that require refrigeration and plan arrangements to get to a cooling center, if needed.
- 2. Think about what you may need to maintain your health, safety, and independence. Gather provisions such as wheelchair batteries, oxygen, catheters, non-perishable food, water, items for pets, a cooler, and anything else you may need.
- 3. Be watchful for signs of heatstroke and dehydration. These include shallow breathing, a lack of perspiration, dizziness, dry mouth, and headaches.
- 4. Ever had a muscle cramp on a really hot day, while doing some heavy lifting? There's a good chance the temperature is to blame. What's happened is that you've sweated out a lot of water, but even if you've been drinking water to replace it, you're not getting enough electrolytes. The resulting salt imbalance is what's causing the cramps.
- 5. Check on family, friends, and neighbors who may not have air conditioning, especially those who spend much of their time alone or are more likely to be affected by extreme heat.

### A Taste of the Daniel Plan: Shocking Statistics

Recently local physician, Dr. Matt Frahm, published an article about the state of health in the U.S. In it, Frahm posted a Top 10 list of U.S. health statistics. Did you know...

- 1 in 10 kids are on a psychotropic medication
- 1 in 9 adults over 20 years old have diabetes
- 1 in 8 deaths are NOT considered preventable (that means 7 in 8 ARE preventable)
- 1 in 7 adults (or more) are on cholesterol controlling drugs
- 1 in 6 kids are considered developmentally disabled
- 1 in 5 pre-adolescents are considered obese
- 1 in 4 women are on an antidepressant
- 1 in 3 Americans get cancer
- 1 in 2 people die of their first symptom of heart disease....a heart attack
- 1 in 1 can focus on an area of their health TODAY and make it 1% better

The last statistic is the good news! YOU, in many cases, are responsible for the quality of your own health. While it is true that some people contract an illness or health condition, the majority of the state of

ty of those are actually lifestyle diseases, which are brought on by the way a person lives. Many people assume having high cholesterol and high blood pressure is genetic or a part of aging. This is not true! In a lot of cases, merely changing your diet from processed foods to natural, nutrient-dense foods and increasing your activity can have a big impact on lowering those numbers. (We have first-hand experience with a number of people that have found that to be true.)

Depression is a complicated condition with a plethora of causes. Still, we find it alarming to see that 1 in 4 women are on antidepressants. It saddens us to know that few people know that many foods they consume can cause or contribute to depressive symptoms. Many of the preservatives, colorings, and flavorings that are used in processed foods are considered neurotoxins, which can alter one's brain chemistry resulting in depressive feelings. Couple that with the hopelessness that can come when someone feels unhealthy and you have a recipe for clinical depression!

The Daniel Plan is a step by step process designed for you to work with God and others that care about you to help you rise above the statistics. You will learn about finding peace and focus in your life along with healing food and

movement that will give you the energy and vitality to be the person God designed you to be.

### **Tutor News**

Webster defines a tutor as one who provides individual instruction. At Ascension, it is that and so much more. Our tutors have developed warm relationships with individuals who have come to the U.S. and then to Waukesha for freedom of worship and for a better life for themselves and their children.

Saturday mornings from 10 a.m. until noon, one can find up to 29 students and 31 tutors engaged in learning English in the educational wing at Ascension. Subject matter includes learning to count, making change, introducing oneself, or preparing to take the citizenship exam. Topics are selected on a monthly basis. In August, the topic is: School/Learning/Library. September will include: Measures/ Directions/Geography. Support for instruction comes through our partnership with Greater Waukesha Literacy (GWL). Tutors are provided an orientation session, introductory materials, and access to resources and expertise of the program coordinators at GWL. At Ascension, we have a good variety of tools to support instruction.

One may tutor an individual student or group of up to four students who have the same level of English ability. Tutors at Ascension are matched with another tutor so that if you need to miss one or more Saturdays, your partner can work with your student or students. Students range from age 5 to 80 and may have little knowledge of English or American customs. Some students are very proficient in English and may be studying to pass the Citizenship Test.

If you think you might want to become a tutor, we are having an orientation/ information session on Monday, Aug. 14, at 6 p.m., in East Hall. Returning tutors will join us at 7 p.m. to kick off the fall program. If you know someone who may benefit from tutoring, please let me know.


