### Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here. He has risen."— Luke 24:5

appy Easter! Maybe it's just me, but Lent seemed exceptionally long this year. I'm so glad our Hallelujah time is finally here! On Easter morning, we arrive at the tomb with the faithful women who come to anoint Jesus' body as was the religious custom of the day. But instead of the traditional anointing, the women experience an encounter that is unbelievable. Early that Sunday morning, while it was still dark, the women went to the tomb with spices and oils to anoint Jesus' body for burial. They had no idea how they would enter the tomb because of the large stone covering



the entrance. They wondered who would roll the stone away for them. But they walked to the tomb in faith. Upon their arrival, they saw that the stone had already been rolled away. But that was just the beginning of their astonishment. They went in the tomb but Jesus was not there. The women were perplexed. But then they were greeted by two men in dazzling white garments. The angels asked them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? Jesus is not here. He is risen!" Terrified, these faithful women bowed their faces to the ground. The men in dazzling clothes reminded them of what Jesus said. And then the women remembered the promise of our savior. Jesus' promise was beyond belief. Jesus promised that after he endured the horrible and dishonorable death of the crucifixion, he would live again. Jesus promised that on the third day he would rise from the grave.

Certainly these events were beyond belief, but that didn't stop these dedicated women. This loyal band of women rushed home to share the Good News with the rest of the disciples. Arguably, they are the first evangelists of the Good News. Christianity owes a debt to these women. In fact, this event was the beginning of all Christian preaching. But unfortunately, that first Easter sermon, when the women proclaimed, "Jesus is not dead. He is RISEN! He is risen indeed, HALLELUJAH!" fell flat. Nobody believed them because women were not considered to be credible witnesses. Thankfully, at the end of the day, the disciples' belief, or unbelief for that matter, is irrelevant. The promise of the Resurrection is not contingent upon our belief because Jesus is beyond belief. The truth, the power, and the mystery of the resurrection does not depend on the disciples' belief, confusion, questions, skepticism, or doubts. When Jesus exhaled, "It is finished", he was going on a journey to hell and back to make a way of salvation for every doubting, questioning, disciple that ever lived (or ever will live).

Two thousand years ago, Jesus made a way of salvation for all of humanity. Jesus is greater than our deepest fears. Jesus is beyond our heaviest doubts. Jesus is even beyond our staunchest, most faithful beliefs. Christ has triumphed. He is living! Hallelujah!





We have reported in the past that 70 percent of your immune system is located in your gut. Yes, it is true that your gut is what keeps you resistant to colds, flu and even more



### Meru Day of Prayer

On April 27th Ascension will join other congregations in the Greater Milwaukee Synod for a day of Prayer with the Diocese of Meru. Our brothers and sisters in the Meru Diocese of Tanzania will feel the power of prayer and love of Christ as we lift them up in prayers of thanksgiving, prayers for peace and prayers for strength, hope and wisdom.

The Tanzania Lutheran Church has a vision to reach out with the Gospel to 50 percent of the un-reached people of Tanzania. Each Christian in the church is made aware of the involvement in mission activities as they

reach out with both sharing the Gospel and living the Gospel through social services. Through this outreach the Tanzania Lutheran Church has grown to over 6.1 million people in a population of 45 million people. Mission and Evangelism is the backbone of the Church. Such a focus is a positive response to the Great Commission of our Lord to proclaim the Gospel to all Nations.

### **Global Partnerships**

As a part of our covenant with our partners in El Salvador and Tanzania, we commit to learn more about their cultures. We enjoyed a fun and tasty way to experience that by sharing soups from each of the countries at a recent Lent soup supper. We tried Salvadoran soups such as: Sopa de Pollo Salvadoreña (Salvadoran Chicken and Vegetable Soup), Salvadoran Red Bean Soup, and Sopa de Chorizo con Huevos (Salvadoran Chorizo and Egg Soup). From Tanzania, we experienced the new flavors of: Ndizi Na Nyama (Meat and Banana Stew), Coconut Pumpkin Soup, and African Peanut Soup. These soups were among 13 soups from our partner countries and the 120 home made tortillas made by Jenny Aparicio. Thank you to all the experimental chefs. What a fun way to share our journey of becoming better familiar with our brothers and sisters from El Salvador and Tanzania!



### **Outreach for Hope Devotions**






America's Black Holocaust Head Griot Reggie Jackson

### Treasurer's Report

ontribution shortfalls continue for the month of February. Last month we were short of contribution goals by \$8,300 and this month the figure is negative \$7,300. The results are unfavorable when compared to last year at this time as well, when contributions were \$5,400 more than they were this year.



On the spending side, our expenses were right in line with the budget figures. Your church leaders are doing a fine job of managing the funds they have to work with.

Our rental homes have undergone some renovation before changes in tenants. Repairs have been completed at 1325 Dopp St. for \$7,000. New tenants have moved into 1319 Dopp St. Clean-up has been done on 412 S. Moreland. The Moreland property was put on the market and, very shortly, received an accepted. Good news.
